Waddell & Reed Kansas City Marathon with Ivy Funds Health & Fitness Expo open to the general public

KANSAS CITY, MO (September 22, 2014) – The Waddell & Reed Kansas City Marathon with Ivy Funds will kick-off marathon weekend October 16 and 17 with a free Health & Fitness Expo. Over 100 vendors from around the country will share their merchandise and expertise with an expected 36,000 attendees. In addition to the vendors, all race participants will pick up their race packets at the Expo.

"The Health and Fitness Expo is free and open to the public both Thursday and Friday," said President & CEO Kathy Nelson. "We have such a wide range of vendors, there is something for the entire family."

Expo hours are Thursday, October 16, 3-8 p.m. and Friday, October 17, 11 a.m. – 8 p.m. The Expo is located at the Crown Center Exhibit Hall A, 2323 McGee Street, which is connected to the Sheraton at the north end of Crown Center. Parking is free with validation (up to 3 hours).

New in 2014: Free Wi-Fi will be provided by PSAV and Sheraton Kansas City Hotel at Crown Center to all attendees and exhibitors for the entire duration of the Health & Fitness Expo. It will be a basic Wi-Fi service to allow everyone to have a solid connection to access social media, internet and email.

The Waddell & Reed Kansas City Marathon with Ivy Funds includes a full marathon, half marathon, five-kilometer run, marathon relay and a kids marathon.
