The Waddell & Reed Kansas City Marathon with Ivy Funds goes blue Saturday

KANSAS CITY, MO (October 16, 2014) – To celebrate the Kansas City Royals winning the American League Championship title and heading to the World Series next week, the Waddell & Reed Kansas City Marathon with Ivy Funds is going blue on Saturday, October 18. All participants and spectators are encouraged to wear blue at the race.
