Big 12 Run returns to Kansas City in March with new 12K distance

KANSAS CITY, MO (February 26, 2015) – Kansas City's Big 12 Run returns to Kansas City for the third year and this time a new distance has been added. Participants will have the opportunity to choose between a 5K distance and the new 12K distance, which is 7.46 miles. This family-friendly event is set in the heart of Big 12 country and takes place on the last day of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship on Saturday, March 14 starting at 10 a.m.

For the first time in race history, <u>Team Red, White and Blue</u> (Team RWB), a veteran nonprofit organization, will be running the 12K course carrying a flag to represent each of the Big 12 schools. Team RWB's mission is to enrich the lives of America's veterans by connecting them to their community through physical and social activity.

The participants will experience a new course, which starts on 12th Street and Grand where they will head north on Grand turn right on eighth street then head south on Holmes. The 12K participants will turn left on Truman Road and will meet back up with the 5K participants at 18th and Grand before finishing together back at 12th and Grand. Click here for course map.

Each participant will receive a commemorative T-shirt and a finisher's medal. Prizes will be awarded to the overall male and female winners.
