Garmin Kansas City Marathon to Feature a New Course in 2021

KANSAS CITY, MO (April 14, 2021) – The <u>Garmin Kansas City Marathon</u> will introduce a <u>new course</u> in 2021 that features a start and finish line at Kansas City's world-renowned Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art. The Finish Line Festival Presented by <u>T-Mobile</u> will take place in Theis Park, located just south of the start/finish.

Scheduled to take place in-person on **Saturday, October 16, 2021**, the Garmin Kansas City Marathon is Kansas City's largest and most exciting annual race event that takes runners on a tour through the coolest neighborhoods and past the most beautiful landmarks including the World War I Museum and Memorial, the Country Club Plaza, Waldo, Westport, the 18th & Vine Jazz District and more. Additional protocols will be implemented for this year's race to ensure the safety of participants, volunteers and staff. Distance options for participation include a 5K, 10K, Half Marathon presented by Geico and Full Marathon.
